Project **Outputs**

Support services for migrant workers

Introduce effective and transferable mechanisms, services, and tools to enhance the integration of migrant workers in the labour market, such as language courses, skills training, job mapping, and referral mechanisms to better connect migrant workers with employment opportunities.

Capacity building for employment officers and local authorities

Support key labour stakeholders in facilitating the employment of migrant workers in the primary sector through a specialised training programme, using the proposed mechanisms and tools.

Partnerships and policy recommendations

Foster cooperation and establish lasting partnerships among key stakeholders through networking events, while providing actionable, evidence-based policy recommendations for the effective socio-economic integration of migrant workers in the primary sector across Europe.
